We have many students at Rogich Middle School currently enrolled in Pre-AP and accelerated classes one or two grades above their age specific grade placement. The testing data helps to identify student potential to ensure appropriate placement.

It is important that students are in school daily and on time every day, especially during the testing period. Students will be allowed to either purchase a snack from the student store before school, or students may bring a snack to eat during the testing period. We encourage students to get to bed early to ensure adequate sleep and to also eat a good breakfast during the testing period. Research clearly supports the benefits of sleep and nutrition resulting in higher academic performance.

We appreciate your support as together we encourage students to do their best and be in attendance during all of the testing period. We wish them all the best on the SBAC and final MAP testing of the year and thank our teachers for their high quality instruction and student preparation.

To limit the number of visitors on campus and disruptions during the student academic learning day, please remember our policy of not allowing personal items to be dropped off for students.

I would also like to reach out to parents who might be interested in helping us monitor the driveway before and after school. As you know, we do not allow traffic to come up the driveway before and after school for safety reasons. When we do not have a staff member at the driveway, it appears that parents forget or feel it is ok to drive up the driveway. This puts our students in a very unsafe situation and creates a traffic jam that also adds to the safety issues. We continue to have numerous students arriving late to school as parents are dropping students off after the bell to use the driveway and avoid traffic. We do still follow the single point of entry and students must enter on Pavilion Center Drive.
