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Parents and Students:

We are excited to begin the 2026-2027 school year at Rogich Middle School. Opening day for students is **Monday, August 10, 2026. Our new start time is 7:30 AM with dismissal at 1:41 PM.**

Student achievement, participation, and overall student safety are all notably affected by the positive practices we integrate within the learning environment. Thank you for taking a minute to review the procedures and practices with us. Together we can make a difference and ensure success for all students.

Rogich Middle School Guidelines for Academic Success and Student Safety

School Safety continues to be our number one priority. To ensure success for everyone, we have developed a school wide safety plan with responsibilities assigned to each of us. All of us working together as a team will ensure a safe environment for students, parents and staff. It is important that we communicate responsibilities as we begin the new school year, so all students, parents and staff are aware and understand our personal responsibilities within the safety plan.

We appreciate everyone taking responsibility for their actions and their own understanding of the plan. Once again, everything we do has a purpose as we strive for overall school safety and student achievement.

Attendance and Punctuality

Research clearly shows attendance and punctuality are the number one predictors of overall student success. We want all students to be present every day to ensure academic success. We thank you for scheduling vacations, and other appointments outside of the school day when possible.

School begins promptly at 7:30 AM. Parents, thank you for taking responsibility, making sure students arrive on time daily ready to engage in the learning process. Please plan ahead and make sure all students arrive no later than 7:25 to ensure adequate time to access lockers and be prepared for class. Anticipate traffic delays and develop a plan so students do not miss valuable instruction.

When students arrive late, valuable instruction is lost, and students are immediately behind within the class period and overall course content.

We are here to help in any way we can to ensure that students are in school and on time every day. Thank you for taking the responsibility as a parent to ensure students arrive on time.

Students must also arrive to each class on time throughout the day. Excessive tardiness and absenteeism will be addressed.

Single Point of Entry and Exit

All students must enter and exit through the doors on Pavilion Center Drive which aligns with our safety plan. The front driveway will be closed to incoming traffic before and after school to ensure student and staff safety.

Students arriving later will need to enter through the front doors to receive a pass to class. Please drop students off on Pavilion Center and they may utilize the front sidewalk toward the front doors. The tardy will be unexcused unless the student submits a note from the parent stating the reason for

the late arrival. Continued late arrival times may result in loss of credit. Please note, it is the parent's responsibility to ensure students arrive on time each day.

Arrival

All students may enter the Pavilion Center doors at 7:10. Students wishing to eat breakfast will go directly to the cafeteria. Students will remain in the cafeteria until the bell rings at 7:25.

The doors at Pavilion Center will be locked at 7:30. Students arriving late must enter through the front doors and receive their tardy pass to class.

To ensure safety, students will not be allowed in the hallways or classrooms prior to 7:25. We have eliminated many behavior issues when students are not waiting on campus for doors to open. Please do not drop students off prior to 7:10. Supervision is not provided prior to that time.

Dismissal

The school day ends at 1:41 PM. Students will exit through the Pavilion Center doors, unless they are riding a bus. Students riding a bus will exit through the doors by the gymnasium toward the bus parking lot.

Parents will not be allowed to arrive early and park in the front parking lot to wait for dismissal. We want to maintain safety for everyone. Thank you for understanding and helping us to follow the CCSD single entry/exit policy. We found it to be very effective.

When students are dismissed, they will not be allowed to re-enter the building or wait for parents in the front parking lot. Please make arrangements to pick up your students on Pavilion Center Drive or use the Leisure Center parking lot. The driveway will be closed to incoming traffic.

Lanyards & Student IDs

All students are required to wear a school-issued lanyard and ID while on campus. IDs will be issued during student picture days, August 13–14. Replacement or additional IDs and lanyards may be purchased from the school banker. We recommend that students leave their lanyard in their locker at the end of the day, ready for daily use, or purchase a second lanyard if they prefer to wear lanyards home. Students must exhibit the lanyard prior to entering the classroom or cafeteria.

Transportation Safety

To ensure student safety to and from school as well as on the Rogich Campus, students may ride only pedal bicycles. Motorized bicycles, motorized scooters, regular scooters and skateboards may not be used for transportation to and from school and will not be allowed on campus. We witnessed numerous accidents and thefts involving motorized bicycles and scooters. We know you want to ensure the safety of students as well, and we thank you for understanding.

Students must walk their bicycles through the quad area after entering the doors on Pavilion Center Drive and again at dismissal. The bicycle rack will be open daily beginning at 7:10. Bicycles will not be allowed in the school bus parking lot or on campus with the exception of the bicycle rack.

The Leisure Center has informed us they will not allow parked bicycles or scooters on their property during the school day.

Dress Code

Students must follow the CCSD Dress Code Policy. The dress code policy is on our website and will be enforced. Students out of dress code will be sent to the Student Success office and parents will be contacted so that appropriate clothing can be made available.

Dropping off Items for Students

Students must remember to bring all items necessary for the day. We will not accept items dropped off in the front office once the school day begins. Unnecessary interruptions take away from the learning environment. It is the student and parent's responsibility to remember to bring everything necessary each day. Chromebooks may be available on a checkout basis if forgotten. It is the student's responsibility to bring their charged Chromebook daily.

Cell Phones

Cell phones are not to be used during the school day. If a student has an emergency, they may come to the office and use their cell phone, if necessary. Cell phones must be put away in backpacks or lockers throughout the day as required by the Clark County School District and in accordance with the regulation. Students may request a cell phone pouch.

If phones are visible during the day, an adult will hold on the phone until the parent can pick it up. This will ensure that phones do not disrupt the learning environment.

We understand that students need to contact parents at the end of the school day to arrange transportation. Students may use cell phones after the dismissal time of 1:41.

Gum, Backpacks and other items brought to school

Because of health risks and the problems arising from the amount of gum left on the ground and found in other inappropriate places on campus, students and staff must refrain from chewing gum during the school day while on campus.

To ensure full attention during the instructional day, students must keep all headphones, ear buds, air pods or other similar devices at home. Backpacks must be stored in lockers and will not be allowed in the classroom, lunchroom or hallways.

Students may purchase a Rogich locker bag for PE uniforms or to simply keep their lockers organized. Locker bags may not be used in the classroom.

We encourage students to plan for the day and take all books and instructional items with them to class. Students find it successful to plan a morning routine of books and notebooks for AM classes and utilize the locker after lunch, exchanging books and notebooks for afternoon classes.

Lockers

Lockers will be assigned to all students and may be used before school, before and after lunch, and after school. Students must keep their locker combination to themselves. We will not be responsible for items taken from lockers. Students will receive a new combination to their own personal locker. Students may not share lockers. Back pass passes will not be issued to students. All backpacks must be stored in the lockers.

Behavior

Rogich is a No Bully Zone. Administrators and Counselors will provide opportunities for students to report and discuss any bullying situations to ensure student safety. Substantiated bullying will result in disciplinary consequences.

Students involved in Physical altercations and/or violence will receive appropriate consequences aligned with CCSD Code of Conduct, regulations and policies.

We appreciate everyone working together to ensure student and staff safety. It is important that we all understand and follow the guidelines and practices in place at Rogich Middle School, recognizing the importance and purpose of the procedures in place.

When students, teachers and families feel safe and recognize the importance of school safety, everyone can focus on academic and social priorities. Together, we can make a difference.
